Inclusive Playground Underway

Work on our Inclusive Playground started over Winter Break! Concrete was poured to create a hard surface path connecting the blacktop to the field. This level surface provides access for all children to get to the field. In the next phase, we will be adding three pieces of playground equipment that are accessible to all students- a Rock-n-Ship, an Inclusive Spinner, and swing set with harnesses. The Lopez PTA is continuing to fundraise to support the completion of this project and to purchase the Web Crawler as a memorial for Vale Wolkow. **Please support** the upcoming Boosterthon Fun Run. Money raised during the Jan. 22- 31 Fun Run will go to complete these two projects.

New this year, all automated PSD and school phone calls will come from one main number: 970-490-3050. In the past, the number displayed as 1-866-316-3462. PSD made this change with our families and staff in mind. Some shared feedback that they didn't always answer the 866 number thinking it was spam. Parents, guardians and staff members who may have previously saved the 866 number in their phone as a contact will need to re-save the new number. If you miss a phone call or voice message from the district, you may call the number above and listen to the last 10 voice messages sent to your phone (most recent will play first).

Attendance Update from Mrs. Day, Assistant Principal

I hope you and your family are settled in after the holidays. This is the time of year when winter takes a toll on school attendance. Snow and slushy weather can keep parents from getting their children to school. So can the colds, fevers and earaches that often come with the winter months.

These absences, even if they are excused, can add up to academic trouble. If it is a snowy day but school is still open, students miss out on learning if they aren't in class. These absences can result in lower test scores and grades.

There's not much we can do about the weather, but there are two key steps every family can take to help avoid absences this year.

1. Develop back up plans for getting your children to school in winter weather. That could mean checking with other families who have a car that can manage in the snow or forming a "walking school bus" to walk your children to school with other parents. If you're stuck, call the school. We can connect you with other parents or staff members who can help.

2. **Keep your children healthy.** Dress them warmly for the cold weather and make sure they've got hats and gloves. Encourage them to wash their hands regularly. If your children do get sick, use the information below to decide whether or not to keep them home.

WHEN IS SICK TOO SICK FOR SCHOOL?



Send me to school if ...

I have a runny nose or just a little cough, but no other symptoms.

I haven't taken any fever reducing medicine for 24 hours, and I haven't had a fever during that time.

I haven't thrown up or had any diarrhea for 24 hours.





Keep me at home if...

I have a temperature higher than 100 degrees even after taking medicine.

I'm throwing up or have diarrhea.

My eyes are pink and crusty.



Call the doctor if...

I have a temperature higher than 100 degrees for more than two days.

I've been throwing up or have diarrhea for more than two days.

I've had the sniffles for more than a week, and they aren't getting better.

I still have asthma symptoms after using my asthma medicine (and call 911 if I'm having trouble breathing after using an inhaler).

Inclement Weather Procedures

INCLEMENT WEATHER PLAN

When the weather is too rainy or too cold for children to be outside the following will be used:

- District guidelines for decisions are based on an **outside temperature of ten degrees or less**. In case of wind chill factors or wet conditions, the principal or designee will make the decision in the best interest of the children.
- Flags will be posted at the corners of the buildings on mornings we are indoors before school.

Snow Expectations at Lopez

Please dress for the weather! Students will play outside unless the wind chill is below 10 degrees.

SNOW EXPECTATIONS

- Appropriate winter snow dress is required to play in the snow. This includes:
 - Snow boots or water-proofed all-weather boots.
 - Snow pants or other water-proofed pants are recommended, but not required.
 - Clothing appropriate to the temperature including coat, mittens or snow gloves and/or hats.
- Snow stays on the ground. It can be used to build but does not fly through the air.
- Snow mounds are out of bounds.

Troutman Park concerns

Parents have reported some concerns about teen behavior at Troutman Park. If you see anything that is concerning, please report it quickly using one of the following methods:

- 1. Call the non-emergency police number at 970-221-6540 any time concerning behavior is observed.
